Declaration of Intent between Flanders and the Czech Republic

Both parties

Mr. P. Pithart Prime Minister of the Czech Republic,

and

Mr. L. Van den Brande, Minister-President of the Government of Flanders and Minister of Economic Affairs, Small and Medium-Sized Businesses, Science Policy, Energy and Foreign Relations,

met in Brussels on May 14th, 1992, and made the following statement:

- 1. Both parties have the opinion that the historical changes in Europe create new possibilities for tightening the existing bonds of friendship and for developing integrated, closer and overall cooperation between both parties. In this way, they intend to contribute to a further European integration.
- 2. Both parties agree that the initial foundations for cooperation were already laid when the declaration of intent and the statement involving training programmes in Flanders for Czech business managers was signed on June 3rd, 1991 and when the cooperation protocol regarding education was signed on September 13th, 1991. They want to develop and extend this cooperation and involve employment and training, scientific research, culture, health care, social deliberation, welfare, infrastructure, traffic, environment, town and country planning.
- 3. To this end, they will:

create a permanent deliberation platform exchange information, documentation and expert knowledge

promote collective cooperation projects encourage and enhance cooperation between firms, research institutes and the social partners

cooperate within the framework of programmes of international bodies.

4. Both parties agree to assign a collective working group, reporting directly to the Minister-President of Flanders and the Prime Minister of the Czech Republic, with the preparation of a global and integrated cooperation-agreement and flexible operating programmes.
